## ARBOR HOUSE ADMISSION CRITERIA

## Individuals considered to be appropriate for admission:

- Have a mental illness or co-occurring disorder
- Not imminently at risk of harm to self or others
- Passive suicidal ideation without a plan and willing to contract for safety
- Psychotically disorganized and at risk of suffering serious harm due to a lack of capacity to protect themselves from harm or provide for their basic human needs
- Medically stable and/or have a chronic medical condition that can be managed in a CSU setting
- Able to be redirected
- Not aggressive during evaluation
- Reasonably cooperative during the prescreening evaluation
- Decompensation with a potential for improvement based on past history
- Able to be managed in an unlocked setting/not considered to be a flight risk
- Do not have a history of aggressive behavior

## Individuals considered to be inappropriate for admission:

- Individuals under age 18
- Individuals who are an imminent danger to themselves or others
- Have a history or are seen as an elopement risk
- Have a history of violent behavior, arson, sexual assault, or threatening program staff
- Have a medical condition that cannot be managed in a CSU setting
- Have an impairment in mental status due to dementia, psychosis, or a traumatic brain injury that significantly affects their ability to care for themselves in a CSU setting
- Individuals with a primary diagnosis of substance abuse in need of detoxification
