Does not allow smoking, Seroquel, Gabapentin, or nicotine replacements. For referral, call Stephen and send hospital records via encrypted email. Stephen will review and schedule a phone screening with the client if appropriate.

This is a year-long program that includes 90 days of residential support. It is 12-step and peer-based. Does not allow any medication assisted therapies. Cost is \$16K, due up front. If CSB is funding, they will allow \$8K up front and \$8K at 6-month mark if the client is still there.

This is on average a 30-day, peer-staffed, 12-step based recovery program. Their facility has a male and a female wing. To refer just call main line, do not typically require records to be sent. Is able to accommodate Spanish speakers. Smoking allowed. LGBTQ+ friendly. Does not accept sex-offenders. CSB rate is \$2,800.

This is a CRP for those coming out of incarceration, but they do have a self-pay program for community members at \$150/week for up to 90 days. They have a men's and a women's house. Those with histories of violent offenses, sex offenses, or gang affiliation are not accepted.

This peer-staffed recovery program offers a 28-day intensive program, as well as sober living residences. The CSB rate for the 28-day program ranges from \$4,500 - \$9,800 depending on client needs (can have access to psych eval, increased therapy and coaching sessions, etc. if needed). The rate for their sober living homes is an initial \$150 processing fee along with \$140/week for housing. They can accept referrals straight to their sober living homes, client does not have to complete the 28-day program first. They allow all suboxone and methadone in their sober living homes but not in their 28-day intensive program.

This is a peer-staffed recovery program. They require a 6-month minimum commitment, with no maximum length of stay. They have multiple men's and women's houses, with a total of 33 male beds and 14 female beds. They have one women's house that allows children. Participants start in peer-based PHP, then step down to IOP. All medication assisted treatments are accepted. Program is LGBTQ+ friendly. Smoking is allowed. Sex-offenders on a case-by-case basis. Program provides full wraparound support to the participants. To refer, complete online application and then call. Cost is \$350 for intake, then \$135/week. They will not turn clients away for inability to pay.

This is a self-run, non-profit, peer-staffed recovery program for men (6 beds) who have completed residential SUD treatment (required). It is a 6-month, 3-phase sober living home where peer staff will support clients in obtaining employment, creating and practicing structured daily routines, and building community support networks. Staff is on site 24-hours a day. Daily meeting and group attendance are required. RRHH has community partnerships to support client with SUD and MH treatment needs. Cost is \$135/week once employed. Smoking is allowed. Methadone and buprenorphine not currently allowed, but may be in the future. Sex offenders not allowed. Clients can apply on website.

This is a self-run program with male and female transitional homes, structured to serve those exiting incarceration, experiencing homelessness, or struggling with SUDs. Participants work with a "pathway navigator" to support in recovery and individual goals. Program is free of cost and requires a 6-month commitment.
